GLAMIS ADVENTURE PLAYGROUND

From all the children, staff and trustees at Glamis we'd like to say a massive thank you to BACB. 33 On Thursday 20th May 2021, BACB colleagues participated in restoration activities at the Glamis Adventure Playground. Operated by The Shadwell Community Project, Glamis Adventure Playground was one of London's first adventure playgrounds when it was built on former wasteland in the late 1960s. The park encourages the development and wellbeing of children through social interaction, problem solving, and tolerance in a supervised environment.

Changes to key personnel in the past 18 months meant the overall state of the playground had suffered. The new team is working on a programme to rebuild the facilities for the benefit of the children and the community who rely on this space.

Our colleagues volunteer to assist with key tasks such as sorting out the wood store, turning old tyres into planters, and general refurbishment to improve and restore the facilities. This project helps build a safer environment for children to grow up in and makes a real difference to the outdoor community spaces of the Borough of Tower Hamlets, a lifeline for families particularly during the nationwide lockdown.

BACB enjoyed a day out in nature working together with the Essex Wildlife Trust at the Chafford Gorges Nature Discovery Park on 18th June 2021.

The Essex Wildlife Trust is a leading conservation charity established in 1959. The charity aims to protect wildlife for future generations, managing over 8,400 acres of land on 87 reserves, two nature parks and 11 visitor centres. Chafford Gorges Nature Discovery Park covers 200 acres and is home to birds, butterflies, and other wildlife, as well as providing green space for the 16,000 people in the surrounding area.

Our colleagues were tasked with conservation activities that help preserve the ecosystem at the park. Colleagues contributed to sustainability efforts with seasonal pruning, building floating bird boxes and maintaining the footpaths. Although the pandemic halted all work and projects on site, BACB volunteers were thrilled to return and continue supporting the park's outstanding natural beauty.
